PATIENT STORY

THE GIFT OF TIME AND TENDERNESS: JENNY'S STORY

The first time Jenny (not her real name) gave birth, in January of 2017, she was a mere sixteen years old. Not long afterwards, her gynecologist, perfectly agreeable to accommodating an adolescent unwed mother's lifestyle, fitted her with an IUD. It was only a few months later that Jenny missed a period.

“That’s normal for someone with an IUD,” the gynecologist told her when she called, concerned. “It’s nothing to worry about.” The doctor made no suggestion that Jenny take a pregnancy test nevertheless. Neither did she mention that it’s possible for someone with an IUD to become pregnant. Most importantly of all, Jenny’s gynecologist didn’t advise her that when someone with an IUD does become pregnant, that pregnancy will likely be complicated or high-risk.

A few months later, Jenny arrived in the INOVA Fair Oaks Hospital Emergency Room in excruciating pain. Her own OB/GYN had moved away from this area and, as it turned out, Jenny was indeed pregnant. Now her ectopic pregnancy had ruptured, and she had to be rushed to surgery. Dr. Cvetkovich, on hospital duty at the time, had the unhappy task of removing Jenny’s irreparably damaged fallopian tube.

Following up with Jenny after the surgery, Dr. Cvetkovich learned that no one had ever told this teenager the truth—that the only sure way to avoid pregnancy is abstinence outside of marriage, and that practicing that kind of restraint would be far better for her emotionally and physically. The result had been two pregnancies (one of them life-threatening) before Jenny’s seventeenth birthday, and a permanently diminished reproductive capacity for the future.

In keeping with Tepeyac’s high standards of care for adolescent patients, Dr. Cvetkovich gave Jenny the extra time and tenderness she needed. She communicated essential knowledge about fertility, pregnancy, abstinence, and other matters relating to female wellbeing. Thanks to Tepeyac, this adolescent mother has been enabled to take several giant steps toward womanly maturity. As she moves forward, she does so equipped at last with the information she needs to live a happier, stronger, and altogether healthier life.

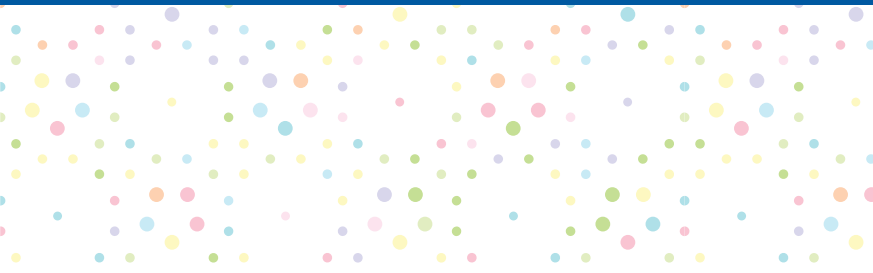
AT THE END OF THE RAINBOW: THE BOBICKS' STORY

Laura was a violin teacher; Brian, that unlikely combination of D.C. police officer and theology student. They met when Brian was moving out of their Alexandria, Virginia apartment complex and Laura was moving in. He asked her out for coffee. Over the next several years, despite Brian's having moved several towns away, they continued seeing each other. At some point in their courtship, Brian's example resulted in Laura's attending religious instruction classes and being received into full communion with the Catholic Church. They were wed in 2015 at Blessed Sacrament Church in Alexandria. Not long afterwards, Laura became a Tepeyac patient.

By 2016, the Bobicks were expecting a child. Laura's pregnancy confirmation appointment with Tepeyac was a joyous occasion, to be followed at eight weeks' gestation by another appointment for an ultrasound. It was at that appointment that everything changed. Tepeyac's doctors determined that the Bobicks' baby had stopped growing at six weeks.

After Tepeyac's doctors having told her what to expect, Laura elected to deliver her baby in privacy, at home. Most fittingly, the Bobicks named the child "Innocent." Even in the midst of her grief, Laura felt particularly moved and thankful that Dr. Anderson spoke always of her baby as a baby, not merely as "products of conception" or "tissue." With the help of Tepeyac's doctors, who put the Bobicks in contact with the local miscarriage ministry A Mom's Peace, the heartbreaking problem of finding the tiniest of caskets and a burial site was solved. Innocent Bobick was buried in the cemetery at the Benedictine Monastery in Bristow, Virginia.

As soon as Laura's body had healed from the loss of Innocent, the Bobicks were ready to try for their "Rainbow Baby"—the popular term for a baby born after a fetal demise, miscarriage, or stillbirth. By 2017, Laura was again an OB patient at Tepeyac. This time, despite a scare that required her referral to a high-risk obstetrician, the pregnancy continued essentially without hitches. Tepeyac doctors were happy to work with Laura's plan for a natural birth.



Finally, in the very earliest days of 2018, Dr. Fisk delivered the exquisitely lovely Emery Bobick—a young lady graced with a full head of fine dark hair and a big, inquiring pair of shining eyes that, from the first, were engaged in exploring the entire world around her. When we met her and her parents for lunch recently to hear their story, she was an active, thriving seven-week old. All too clearly, the proud Bobick family had found their pot of gold at the end of the rainbow.

“Tepeyac was one of the many pieces that fell into place in our story,” Brian told us. “From our sacramental marriage, to Natural Family Planning, to the miscarriage of our first child, to the successful birth of our second child, Tepeyac was a blessing to carry us through.”

Laura was in agreement. “Thank you to the doctors, nurses, and administrators at Tepeyac for providing such a caring and pro-life environment for us as patients,” she said. “I can’t imagine going through the joys and trials of pregnancy and childbirth anywhere else, and I am deeply grateful.”

In 2017, Tepeyac saw an average of 92 new patients per month, which is an average increase of 51% per month from the prior year.

MEETING TEPEYAC'S NEEDS

Because Tepeyac is a ministry as well as a business, it must combine grants from Divine Mercy Care with its good business practices in order to balance its the annual budget. Here are a few reasons Tepeyac needs the support of Divine Mercy Care:

- Tepeyac takes most insurances, which do not reimburse the full amount billed, nor do they always pay in a timely manner.
- Providers spend time on education and Divine Mercy Care programs, including spending extra time with medical students rotating to learn about pro-life medicine.
- Most other OB/GYNs depend on the revenue from contraception, abortion, and sterilization, but Tepeyac does not perform these services, opting instead for scientifically-proven methods of Natural Family Planning, prenatal care discounts for women in need, and surgical procedures only when medically necessary.
- About 1 in 3 women that deliver with Tepeyac are in need. This clientele is associated with additional costs:
 - Extra personnel to help with an increased need for language translation, financial aid application help, and connection to local resources.
 - Extra time spent by the doctors to care for these difficult cases.
 - Every abortion-minded woman receives a free first sonogram and prenatal appointment.
 - The lost revenue from providing financial aid for these women through Medicaid, MERCY sliding fee scales, and partnerships with pregnancy centers.



TEPEYAC MARKETING UPDATE

In Fall of 2017, Tepeyac OB/GYN and Divine Mercy Care separated their social media. This was part of the ongoing effort to clarify the difference between the organizations and let Tepeyac focus on marketing and medical care while DMC focuses on the more expanded mission to serve, inspire, and unify as a non-profit.

This year's recipient of the Susan Torres Award had a profound miracle story. Doctors told Diana her baby wouldn't live after birth so she should terminate her pregnancy. Instead, she chose Tepeyac's Kristen Anderson Perinatal Hospice Program. But miraculously, her child lived! After 94 days in Neonatal Intensive Care, her little boy came home and is thriving!

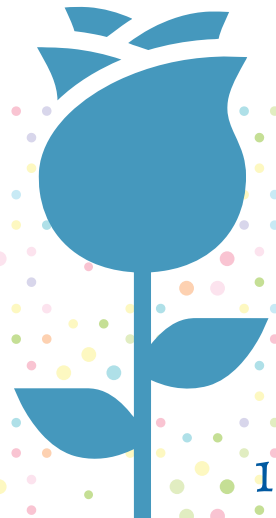

MEDICAL STUDENT ROTATIONS:

This year, we had **3 students** participate in our rotation program, totaling **416 hours** of time being trained by our providers on how to carry on pro-life medicine for the next generation!

Divine Mercy Care helps coordinate the student rotations at Tepeyac as a project of our Medical Education and Outreach Program. For four weeks in the fall of 2017, Jacqueline Ramirez came to Tepeyac OB/GYN as one of her core clinical rotations required to complete her studies for the Master's Degree in Physician Assistant Studies at James Madison University. JMU already had a regular relationship with Tepeyac, and Jackie lived in the area. It was her only rotation with a faith-based practice, and she learned about the powerful impact faith has on patient healthcare. She began by shadowing the Tepeyac doctors, then moved to making initial patient contacts and interviews when the patients agreed to see an interning PA. Finally, she got to assist with some medical procedures. She particularly appreciated witnessing Dr. Bruchalski's love of the whole patient including the spiritual side, his vision of healthcare, and his willingness to give patients the time they need. She was also inspired by the midwife Kim Terhune for her medical artistry, which Jackie attributes to Kim's experience as a loving mother of five.



Jackie especially appreciated seeing that at Tepeyac, all patients, regardless of their ethnic or religious backgrounds, are treated with unfailing respect—something, she pointed out with regret, that you don't see at all medical facilities. The Tepeyac staff would pray with and for the patients if they wished. She liked the comfortable, friendly atmosphere in which patients were never pressured for time, and the respect given to each patient to make her own decision given the different treatment options offered.



One of her cases involved a pregnancy where it was known that a baby had a severe genetic abnormality and unfortunately would not survive very long after the birth. The family wanted to continue with the pregnancy and was provided with all the support they needed. Jackie was grateful to see the family assisted by Tepeyac's Kristen Anderson Perinatal Hospice that facilitated a plan to ensure the parents' wish to baptize their baby and spend every second possible with the baby before they had to say their last goodbyes. Jackie was humbled by the experience she had at Tepeyac, a place where she witnessed rejoicing with those who rejoice at a healthy birth, and mourning with those who mourn a lost child. Providers at Tepeyac honor the grieving process of families with the dignity and respect they deserve.

The entire experience deepened the desire to give of her talents to work for others, and also underscored the importance of faith in medicine. Having taken her PA boards, Jackie will be working for a gastroenterology practice. Additionally, she also wants to be involved in primary medicine, perhaps through volunteer work at a clinic for the poor such as the Mother of Mercy Free Clinic near her home in Manassas. For the long run, Jackie would like to become a medical educator and will be applying for a fellowship to complete a Doctorate in Medical Sciences. Tepeyac is so grateful to have had her.

AAPLOG CONFERENCE

Dr. Bruchalski joined with providers from Bella Natural Women's Care in Colorado and Morning Star OB/GYN in Arizona to write about their pro-life medical practices, which was published in the Issues in Law and Medicine Journal. They presented the material on "How to Have a Pro-Life Medical Practice" to a panel at the conference of the American Association for Pro-Life Obstetricians and Gynecologists (AAPLOG). This collaboration was also part of the national unity project discussed later in this report.

recruiting patients, finding supporters, and
educating the church.*

LOCAL PRO-LIFE UNIFICATION



PREGNANCY SUPPORT NETWORK TRAINING:

Will Waldron presented at the Pregnancy Support Network (PSN), an initiative of the Catholic Diocese of Arlington to bring together pro-life caregivers for networking and professional development. Will's efforts to help pregnancy centers, maternity homes, infant loss experts, and others improve their fundraising is an important part of DMC's local unity program, which seeks to build local collaboration among organizations that serve women and families.

MANASSAS SEES CHANGES:

In Manassas not long ago, the pregnancy center AAA Women for Choice was next to an abortion clinic. Now, the abortion clinic is a free medical clinic run by Catholic Charities! AAA, partly in response to this change, also ceased operations. As the free clinic opened and AAA closed, both of them found ways to partner with DMC and Tepeyac. The Mother of Mercy Free Clinic will refer women to Tepeyac for prenatal care, with Divine Mercy Care paying for that care. AAA is using profits from the sale of their building towards setting up an Endowment Fund in honor of their founder Pat Lohman, which will give donations to DMC earmarked for Tepeyac medical care! Thus, the legacy of AAA's help for women lives on in a new way.

DIVINE MERCY CARE, MOTHER OF MERCY FREE MEDICAL CLINIC, AND TEPEYAC OB/GYN FORGE BONDS OF LOCAL UNITY

On December 6, 2017, the Diocese of Arlington opened the Mother of Mercy Free Medical Clinic on the site of a former abortion facility in Manassas. At the same time, Divine Mercy Care began funding total prenatal care, through Tepeyac, for one of the clinic's needy patients per month.

Recently, we were granted some interview time from the clinic physician's busy schedule. Dr. Scott Ross had this to say about the earliest days of Mother of Mercy Free Medical Clinic's operations.

DMC: Mother of Mercy Free Medical Clinic is a new and exciting venture by the Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Arlington--and we at Divine Mercy Care are excited about it! What led you to undertake your current role with the clinic?

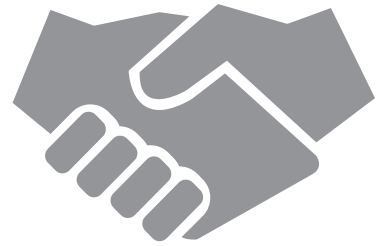
Dr. Ross: About two years ago, I received a call from Art Bennett, President of CCDA. He wanted to talk about an idea that he had. We sat down and he told me of the plan to convert the former abortion facility into a medical clinic for the poor--to bring life to a place of death, to make all things new in Christ. I knew the answer immediately but took a little time to pray about it.

DMC: As of today, the clinic has been open for fewer than three months-- long enough to begin observing some trends and patterns in patient demographics, number of patient visits daily, types of medical situations brought to you for care, etc. Can you talk about those trends and patterns you've observed? Which were expected and which surprising?

Dr. Ross: Of course all of those who come through our doors are underserved, the working poor. The great majority are Spanish speaking... Many have had no healthcare for some time, or others...had started care but were not able to continue with treatment due to financial or social limitations.

We started seeing 12-15 patients per night and now are up to around 25-30.

Diabetes is prevalent and then some of the co-morbidities that go along with it: cardiovascular disease and visual problems. Some of the complexity of the conditions has been surprising, but it has been refreshing to see how the patients want to do what is needed to get better.



DMC: *We're all conscious that the healthcare we provide manifests the Divine Healer's goodness and mercy. We recognize those transcendent moments when that link with the divine is reflected in the face or attitude of a patient. Would you share with us a few such moments that you've experienced since opening Mother of Mercy Free Clinic?*

Dr. Ross: There are three moments that stand out. The first, of course, is seeing the first patient on December 6th ...the reflection of Christ bringing light into a place that was previously dark. The second is a woman who wanted to give something back for the care that she had received. She makes pupusas for a living and brought some to the clinic to give to the staff. Her act of kindness was a reflection of her dignity.

The third is a man with hypertension. It had not been controlled for years, because of many factors. With the help of a local pharmacy, he was able to obtain medication. His joy when he returned, seeing good numbers for his blood pressure readings, was priceless.

DMC: *Tepeyac OB/GYN provides, and DMC funds, the prenatal care for one more of your needy pregnant clients each month. Can you give us an idea how this has been working for you?*

Dr. Ross: As you can imagine, the clinic sees several women weekly requesting prenatal care. It's a blessing knowing that we can send one

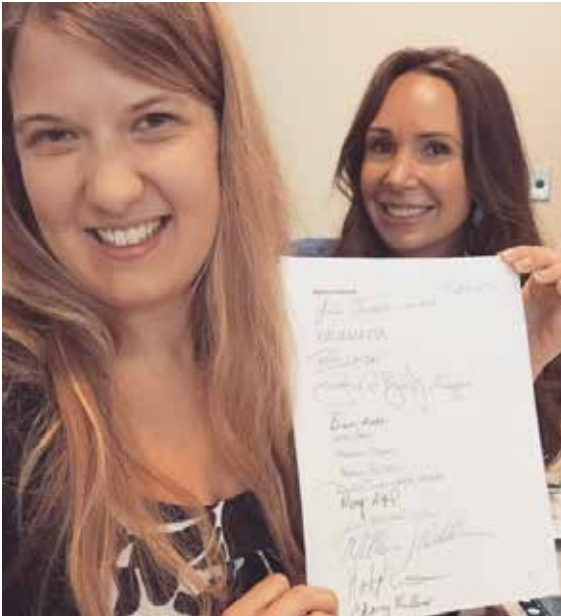
there monthly. Many of these women cannot afford prenatal care. In the most recent meeting with the Greater Prince William Health Coalition, it was noted that there is an increase of women coming to deliver without prenatal care, which poses increased risks. We are blessed to have the opportunity to work with Divine Mercy Care to be able to help some women obtain this care which decreases their chances of complications at delivery. It is also terrific knowing that those whom we send will receive medical care in the same model, being treated in a special way that may not be present elsewhere.

DMC: *In terms of your ongoing relationship with Divine Mercy Care and Tepeyac OB/GYN, what plans would you hope to see formulated for increased cooperation in the future?*

Dr. Ross: It would be great to further the partnership with DMC to grow both pregnancy and women's health services. Also, we would like to receive patients from Tepeyac who have ongoing medical issues.

The opening of Mother of Mercy Free Medical Clinic has provided us with an exciting opportunity to strengthen local unity among pro-life establishments. At DMC and at Tepeyac, we're looking forward to working ever more closely with the clinic, creating bonds that will greatly enhance the work of both organizations.

UNIFY: NATIONAL PRO-LIFE UNIFICATION – FOUNDING PRO WOMEN'S HEALTHCARE CENTERS

In 2017, we knew we wanted to devote more attention to DMC's mission to unify, particularly our National Pro-Life Unification program. We were focused on networking with other centers across the country similar to Tepeyac. The goal was greater unity and greater medicalization for the pro-life movement. The growing excitement for the young project led to it being included as one of the ways we would use Campaign for Mercy funds.

It became clear that the work of Tepeyac is not isolated; other hearts throughout the country have been moved to found similar models of life-affirming medical centers. We met with these like-minded leaders:

- In January in Washington, DC
- In June in Orlando, Florida
- In September in Denver, Colorado
- In October in Phoenix, Arizona

We are grateful for the 15+ partner organizations who have collaborated with DMC to begin Pro Women's Healthcare Centers. Their dedicated staff have spent countless hours as co-founders of this remarkable new program.

PWHC

Each center has its own unique local flavor, but shares together a commitment to ethical, excellent women's healthcare. It was decided that Divine Mercy Care would establish and facilitate a consortium of these practices so that centers that met shared high standards could be certified as members of what has become known as the consortium of Pro Women's Healthcare Centers (PWHC). PWHC was officially launched in January of 2018, and we look forward to telling you more about it in our upcoming communications. We want you to know that such a project would never have been possible without your financial support in 2017. Because you were generous, we were able to take the trips and do the strategic planning necessary to open a new chapter for women's healthcare in America.

Ask And You Shall Receive:

ANNE CHALOUX'S PLANNED GIFT TO THE CAMPAIGN FOR MERCY

Anne Chaloux's involvement with Divine Mercy Care came a few years ago within minutes of her first appointment with Dr. Bruchalski. In their wide-ranging conversation she mentioned that she had worked on the National Cathedral's Gala. He boldly asked whether she would help with the Divine Mercy Care Gala. Inspired by her favorite scripture Matthew 7:7 "Ask and you shall receive," Anne agreed. She soon got to know the DMC staff and found them incredibly joyful and inspiring people among whom she could feel the presence of God. She was astounded by their ecumenical spirit and the range of their activities not only to raise funds for Tepeyac but also to help accomplish the mission to inspire and unify. She was also in awe of Dr. Bruchalski's conversion story.

The career nurse, who had been on three ecumenical overseas missions, soon found herself easily drawn into the DMC orbit. She became an informal fundraiser, contacting some friends whom she thought would share the Tepeyac vision, and successfully urging them to become contributors.

Ironically, just as Anne began considering working out an estate plan, Will Waldron, DMC's Executive Director, asked her to consider including DMC. She was already scheduled to meet with a planned giving expert the next day. This expert, now one of her best friends, recommended that she "just do it". Because of Will's courage to ask and because she was looking for a worthy recipient of an inheritance, she made DMC and Tepeyac her legacy. Anne has arranged that when God calls her home Divine Mercy Care will receive her house and other belongings.

Anne's life has been built around the principle of "ask and you shall receive." She encourages us all not to be afraid to ask for what is needed and to be willing to say yes when asked. She is very optimistic about the future of pro-life medicine and the pro-life movement in general. She says that pro-life work is actually all about choice in the sense that we give women the opportunity, ability, information, and resources to be able to choose what is true, good, and beautiful.



DONOR STORY

Miracle Lab Results:

LARRY AND JENNIFER WATSON SPONSOR THE NEW LAB ROOM

Larry and Jennifer Watson have an extraordinary story built around succeeding miracles – and this is after only six years of marriage. Less than a year after their marriage, Jennifer, a Tepeyac patient since 2005, was diagnosed with stage 4b Hodgkins Lymphoma. The tumors were everywhere in her body. Death was close by as she began chemotherapy. The disease, up until diagnosis, gave her unbearable pain, which was barely relieved later by the most powerful opioids. They began praying to Padre Pio, not for a cure but just to get through the smaller hurdles of treatment. Larry would often spend most of the night on his knees massaging her to relieve her pains as he prayed.

Miracle #1: after three months of treatment, a PET scan showed that the cancer was gone! As a precaution, another six months of chemo was prescribed; a four-part regimen that damaged her lungs and brought on early menopause. Upon completion of treatment, the Watsons consulted Dr. Bruchalski about hormone therapy to restore her fertility. He was not optimistic: Jennifer was about 40; she had undergone intensive chemo and, though her cycle eventually returned, she had begun the equivalent of a

continuous menstrual period that lasted several months, until Dr. Bruchalski stated the need to schedule a hysterectomy. The Watsons prayed and pleaded he run her lab work one more time, and presented their plea to Padre Pio. The very next day Dr. Bruchalski called with the news, “You are as fertile as a 27-year-old!” noting, “I have only seen something like this once in all my practice”.

That day the bleeding stopped Miracle #2 occurred: Jennifer's fertility returned, with cycles completely regular. The Watsons again consulted Dr. Bruchalski. Given all Jennifer had endured with the cancer, he began cautioning that a pregnancy would be risky. They decided to place the decision in God's hands.

Six months later, Miracle #3: Jennifer conceived and they were again in Dr. Bruchalski's care. As he was cautioning that “miscarriages do happen” when he suddenly stopped and said “your guardian angel is shouting at me.” It seemed to them that Dr. B felt, in this case, it was best to be optimistic and discuss what to expect in pregnancy! After an easy, normal pregnancy, Pia Watson, named after Padre Pio, was delivered by Dr. Fisk. Pia is now 19 months old. Miracle

#4 occurred early this past fall. Jennifer, then 44, had conceived again but miscarried after Thanksgiving. Despite the incredible sadness of losing a child, Dr. Bruchalski made it beautiful with his attention, concern, and prayers with them as they commended the child to God.

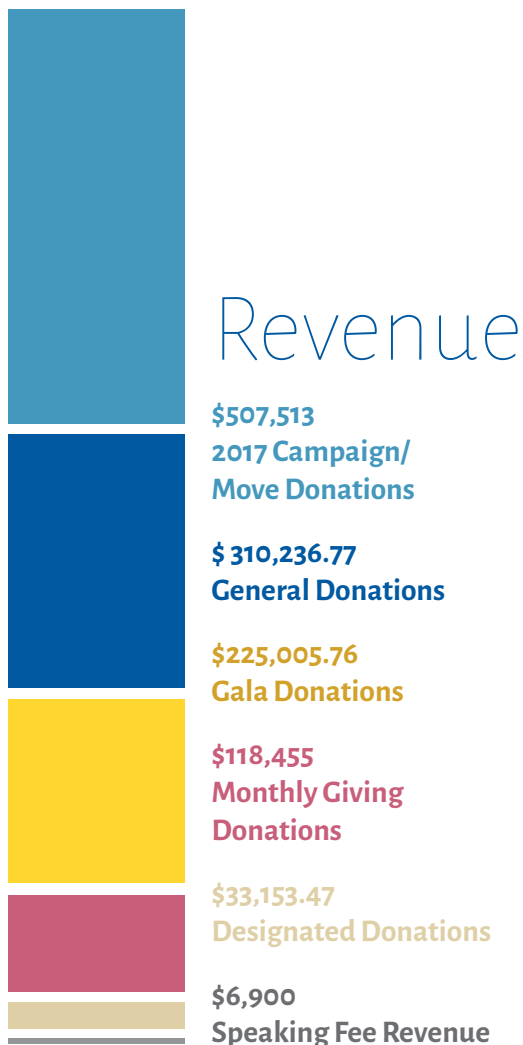

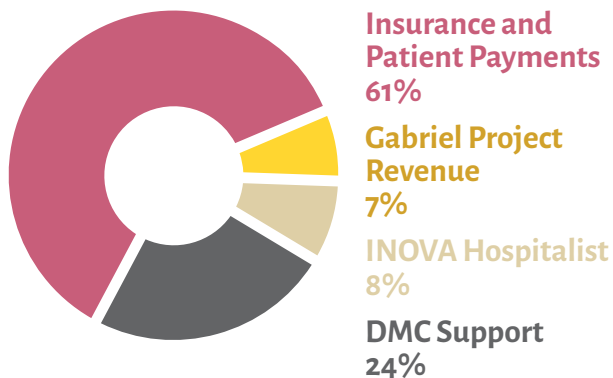
